July 2018 meeting

As we reported on the strands of our church life for which each of us is responsible, we were encouraged by progress in all areas. Particular points of note were:

- The appointment of Ele Buckley as our Children & Families Worker
- Planning well in hand for Awayday on November 3rd
- Nick & Debs Procter have begun visiting each of our Discipleship Groups in their new joint role as DG Leaders' Pastors
- Training sessions held for those involved in leading worship and assisting with Communion

We discussed the feedback received (via post-it notes) on our Mission Action Plan presentation to the AGM in April. We will continue to keep this under review as we monitor progress against the Plan.

We noted the preparations underway for the Alpha Course in the Autumn.

March 2018 meeting

A highlight in the regular reports on our strands was the news that we would be interviewing in just a few days time for the post of Children & Families worker.

There was discussion around the current changes in Data Protection and Safeguarding protocols. Plans are being developed to deal with these matters.

In the area of our prayer life, we will be using the 'Thy Kingdom Come' material again this year for the Novena. Plans are also being developed for a Quiet Day at the beginning of November, and for a follow-up to the successful 'Learning to Pray' course.

We agreed that, for our Leadership Team slot at the AGM this year, we would use the output from the Mission Action Plan review held in October and invite groups to discuss and feed back on this. Anna would also say a few words about future plans for the Leadership Team, including how we might expand to include St Nicholas', in addition to the three LEP churches.

January 2018 meeting

At this meeting, we welcomed Revd Anna Harwood back to the team following her appointment as Vicar. As well as our usual review of our strands, we took the opportunity to present the findings of the MAP review meeting to Anna and also to think about the possible future shape of the Leadership Team. We agreed that the time was right to expand the team to include St Nicholas' Hurst.

With that in mind, we will hold one further meeting of the team in its present form in order to prepare for the AGM in April. We will then hold a meeting in July with representatives from Hurst at which we hope to agree the future shape of the team. The team will then meet in its expanded form from September onwards.

October 2017 meeting

The Leadership Team held an extra meeting on Saturday 7th October. The purpose of the meeting was to take stock of our Mission Action Plan at the halfway point of its first 5 years. In doing this, we took a step back from tracking individual objectives within the plan to look at the wider aims we had set ourselves at the start of the process 2½ years ago.

Starting from our Vision that we are *Loved by Christ and Challenged to Grow*, our Mission Action Plan focuses on four areas for growth.

- Grow in our personal discipleship
- Grow in our corporate discipleship
- Grow in our effectiveness as instruments of the kingdom in our communities
- Grow as congregations

Under each of these headings in the plan, we set out some Aims about the sort of Christian community we want to be if we are to grow in these areas. In our review process, we focused on these Aims, thinking about what progress we have made against each of them, and where God might be leading us next.

Three main themes emerged from our discussion:

- We need to make more of what we have to offer in our different styles of worship and to work on making people feel welcome in our services and activities.
- We need to encourage one another to think carefully about what Sacrificial Service & Giving means for each one of us and to develop a heart for mission in our response to the wider world. (This was one of the five key gospel values we identified back in 2012.)
- We need to do better at reaching out to individuals, particularly those in our congregations and community who may be lonely or vulnerable.

We will reflect on these themes at our next meeting in January and use them to guide our thinking in the months ahead.
